Hello Becky and thank you for your interest in my film 'Against the Odds'. I will fill you in with a bit of background information and how the film came about.

It was the wettest summer on record and we found we had visitors on our family farm in a disused barn where we had placed a barn owl box some years ago. I have visited Antarctica and have developed my own personal way of recording special experiences I encounter and filming the owls was another opportunity to indulge in my hobby and creative side.

At first we were thrilled to have owls nesting, barn owls was a bigger bonus. Soon we discovered 8 eggs during an investigation by the local Nottinghamshire bird ringing group (Nottinghamshire as in Robin Hood Country). The likely hood of all 8 hatching and fledging in such unseasonal weather was remote but I intended to capture what I could on film. Many early mornings and long evenings followed, most of them with rain dripping down my neck, but never loosing hope that I would capture something wonderful. As the weeks passed excitement grew as all 8 hatched. The vole population must have been at its highest and was the main food source; I filmed and witnessed the parent's relentlessly hunting prey for their young. Fluff changed into stubby feathers and then the magnificent plumage emerged which fuelled my excitement of them ALL having a chance to fully fledge.

Soon the local news and national press heard of this remarkable family and the record books came out. We discovered that it was only the third time since records began any where that 8 chicks had been raised successfully and all made it to the world beyond the nest.

The box is still there but no owls yet since our spectacular brood. A few have visited and when the sun is setting its hard not to dream that its one of the original brood which has returned. I wish to send my regards to all M & Ms dedicated following of these truly magnificent birds.

I have recently uploaded on YOU TUBE my latest video called 'Dogs Day'. It shows all our rescued, rehabilitated and often unwanted dogs at play together on our farm. I made the film to celebrate the athleticism of our two border collies competing for the ball. I think you will enjoy this if you love animals.
